SPOTLIGHT ON SPAIN

Spain attracts visitors with a passion for life that is contagious. This spirit manifests itself today through the brilliant architecture, the pounding rhythms of flamenco, and the allure of an afternoon siesta. While life hasn't always been easy in Spain, it has emerged from crises both ancient and modern. In the 16th and 17th centuries, the Spanish Empire ruled over broad regions of Europe and the New World, thriving under the rule of the Hapsburgs during a period known as the Golden Age. When this power waned, Spain entered a darker period, mired in turmoil, civil war, and the dictatorship of Francisco Franco. It wasn't until Franco's death in 1975 that Spain truly joined the modern international community.

Spain continues to have positive economic growth following a prolonged recession stemming from the 2008 global financial crisis. Economic activity surpassed its pre-crisis peak in 2017 largely due to increased private consumption. Favorable financial conditions and strong job creation continue to support the private domestic demand, though unemployment remains high. Strong export growth, driven by increasing labor productivity and an internal devaluation, was significant in bringing Spain's current account into surplus and increased interest from foreign investors. The European Commission criticized Spain's 2016 budget for easing austerity measures and for its alleged overly optimistic growth and deficit projections. Recent projections anticipate the economy to grow and the continuation of job creation.



TOPICS TO EXPLORE

LITERATURE – Explore Spain's literary master: walk in the footsteps of Cervantes, Miguel de Unamuno, Federico Garcia Lorca, and even Ernest Hemingway, visiting sites that inspired their characters.

ART & ARCHITECTURE – From museums to street murals, the art of Spain is deeply ingrained in culture. Visit works of Goya, Velasquez, and other masters in the Prado. Learn about Picasso's life and work. Wander the sites designed by Antonin Gaudí in Barcelona. Trek through Toledo, Salamanca, or the southern regions where Islamic influence is strong.

WINE & CUISINE – Food and wine are central to the Spanish way of life. The Spanish style of small plate or "tapas" is well known, but there is much more to experience and taste at a late dinner in Spain! Taste your way through regions of Spanish cuisine and study the techniques, tools, history, and business of eating and drinking.

Welcome to Seville! This Andalusian capital city is intensely vibrant and steeped in both ancient and modern history. Experience an authentic flamenco show at a tablao in the heart of the city – this is the birthplace of the fiery dance, after all. Don't miss Seville's dramatic monuments – the Giralda tower, the Catedral and the Alcázar.

- At the most common arrival time of all participants, transfer to your accommodations – *Local staff and 1 coach included.*
- Check-in to your accommodations or store luggage if check-in is unavailable.
- Participate in a brief **Health and Safety Orientation** – *2 hour of hotel meeting space, AV not included*
- Free evening with dinner on own.

Setas de Seville

Setas de Sevilla or Las Setas, initially titled Metropol Parasol, is a wooden structure located at La Encarnación square in the old quarter of Seville, Spain. It was designed by the German architect Jürgen Mayer and completed in April 2011 - *entrance to Setas viewpoint included, self-guided.*

Flamenco Dance Lesson – *Lesson is included, pending confirmation.*

- In the evening, walk to the Flamenco performance.

Flamenco Show

Watch a Flamenco performance and appreciate the traditional Spanish folk music and dance that originated in the Andalucía region around 500 years ago! – *admission included.*

Plaza de España & Maria Luis Park

The Plaza de España is a spectacle of light and majesty. Framed in the María Luisa Park, this plaza was designed by the great Seville architect Aníbal González as an emblematic space for the 1929 Ibero-American Expo – *guided, no entrances required, whisper headsets included*

University of Seville

the Old Tobacco Factory, now the seat of the Universidad de Sevilla, is a stone building constructed during the 18th century and housed the very first tobacco factory established in Europe. It is one of the most splendid examples of industrial architecture during the ancient Regime – *guided, no entrances required, whisper headsets included*

- Continue to the Barrio de Santa Cruz

Barrio de Santa Cruz

On this guided tour of Barrio Santa Cruz, you will see the Patio de Banderas (public square located outside the Reales Alcazares), tour the medieval Judería (Jewish Quarter), see the statue of Don Juan Tenorio, and see the ruins of a Roman aqueduct all while listening to tales and legends of the plazas and streets - *guided, no entrances required, whisper headsets included.*

- Return to accommodation on your own on foot.
- Dinner on own. Remainder of the evening is free.

The Real Alcázar de Sevilla

The Real Alcázar de Sevilla served as a royal palace for Moorish kings who occupied Spain and is known for its breathtaking palaces, gardens and walls – *guided, entrance included, whisper headsets included.*

The Cathedral

Enjoy a tour of the Cathedral of Seville. Known for being the largest Gothic cathedral in the world, the Seville Cathedral (Catedral de Santa Maria de la Sede) and its bell tower (La Giralda) took over a century to build and serves as the burial site of Christopher Columbus and his son – *guided, entrance included, whisper headsets included.*

March 12 | Day Trip to Cordoba

Cordoba Walking Tour

Cordoba was once home to populations of Romans, Muslims, Christians and Jews, often in overlapping combinations. Each of these groups left visible imprints upon the city, and students will be able to identify their respective influences. Undoubtedly the most striking example of a culture’s imprint upon Cordoba is the gigantic Mosque, which testifies to the importance of this city during the Muslim era and is so huge as to make the Christian cathedral housed within its walls appear as almost an afterthought – *guided, entrance fees to Cathedral-Mosque and Synagogue and headsets included*
